	The sector has been focusing on re-establishing physical library services across the country following the guidance of the Scottish Government.
	APLS members were extremely positive about the new public library strategy and look forward to working to deliver the aims of the strategy.

11	Students are about to commence the new academic year and will be receiving a hybrid learning delivery. New library services have been introduced to support this including some provision of digital devices and online booking due to limited capacity in libraries.
	The sector is looking at ways to address the costs of eBooks as this is currently a challenge and will be an ongoing need during the restrictions of the pandemic.

	A number of successful exhibitions are in place and will run into late 2021 and 2022.
	Online events have allowed the audience to grow with regular attendance from the whole of the UK, Asia, the Americas and Europe.
